April Montes, Officer of Advocacy, Community College Association of MESA Directors presented information about Mesa Programs and AB 444 (Newman, 2023), which would allow MESA to be a part of Ed Code so MESA would be priority registration. She then entertained questions from the Board members.

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#### F. Student Representation Fee Sustainability

Executive Director Adams informed members about the sustainability of the SSCCC resources if the SRF fee received by colleges is significantly lower than expected. She provided the history of the SSCCC funding sources, reserve policy, minimum operations, other sources of funding, and how long SSCCC could survive if funding was eliminated. VPLA Win informed members that a Legislative Stories Campaign has been developed to collect testimonies to inform specific legislative bills. She noted that there will be a regional competition for the region that collects the most testimonies and asked RADs and LADs to share the information. Regions will be updated as the campaign continues.

# H. <u>Partnership with Organizations serving Black and African American</u> Students

Vice President Hernandez reminded members that the DEIAA committee was charged with researching organizations serving Black and African American students. He highlighted the research and noted that based on research conducted by a DEIAA committee, the DEIAA committee is recommending the SSCCC Umoja Community Foundation.

Motioned, seconded (RAD V Simons) to approve entering into a partnership with Umoja Community Foundation. No objection, the motion passed.
