VOTER REGISTRATION

General Election Date: November 05. 2024

We have been promoting voter registration and voting for the November 5, 2024, General Election. Voting is one of the most direct methods to display student voice. However, many students can be overwhelmed when choosing what party to support, or researching the policies and presidential candidates. It may even seem that your vote doesn't matter, when we take a look at the federal level. However, it is so important to consider that your vote not only counts at the highest level, but even down to your county or city. The current ballot may contain your mayoral candidates, assembly members, city council members, and senators or congress members. They are the people who hold all the power to make legislation that will directly affect you and your college or community. Voting really can directly affect you, and it does require some time to actually go and vote. This is why It is important to plan ahead, make time and take the time to vote. Try and make it an activity of researching how the current ballot Propositions affect you or your community. Plan what day you will vote, and how you will go about doing so, at a polling location, ballot drop off, or mail in ballot. Voting does not have to be last minute or stressful if we approach it thoughtfully.
