Registration deadlines:

- In-person during early voting: Oct 7 Nov 4
- <u>In-person at voting location on Election Day:</u> Nov 5

Voting deadlines:

- Early voting: varies by location
- Return ballot by mail (postmarked by): Nov 5
- Return ballot in person: Nov 5 by 8:00PM
- <u>California sends ballots to actively registered</u> voters: Oct 7 - Oct 26
