To start on a positive note, we have been advocating for student parent resource issues via AB2458 and have successfully reached Governor Newsom's desk for approval! - San Bernardino Valley College & Crafton College were closed September 9th impacted by the Line Fire. Both colleges were closed until September 16th as authorities worked hard to keep the community safe.
- Crafton Hills College delegate Katrina Barringer informed our delegates during our first delegate assembly that Fire Academy staff from her college were called to help efforts. Their student senate is currently reaching out to local fire departments seeking to aid/thank all authorities for their efforts.
- Copper Mountain College representative Mariam Hussein spoke of the K-12 system being closed due to the air quality and fires locally. Childcare became an issue for individuals that were required to work during these times.

If you are in an affected area, the SSCCC has established a need based scholarship to assist you!


