Strengthening Institutional Practices To Support Undocumented Student Success

A collaborative effort between the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), the Foundation for California Community Colleges (Foundation), and Immigrants Rising, the Dreamers Project lays the groundwork for a longer-term program and initiatives needed to meet undocumented students' needs.

The project includes a landscape analysis undertaken through an online survey of community colleges and four regional meetings, as well as guidance from an Advisory Group and a final report submitted to

In the full finalized report, the Foundation and Immigrants Rising present identified, shared challenges in serving undocumented students. Recommendations about how to better serve undocumented students, paired with promising practices underway, are provided for implementation at the individual, group, and institutional levels to create systemic change that benefits California.






Undocumented Students' Most Pressing Needs



Community College Immigration Services

- Provide students, staff, and faculty free immigration legal services, including education and outreach services, on campus
- Help immigrant students and staff understand any potential immigration benefits or remedies they qualify for and receive guidance from a qualified legal service provider
- Increase chances of obtaining immigration benefits or a remedies through the assistance of qualified legal providers
- Empower immigrants with information to navigate the everchanging system of laws and policy

Accessing Services

- 65 host campuses across the 7
 Guided Pathways.
- Most host campuses are within 11 miles or less 30 min by public transit
- Students from ALL colleges can access Immigration Services

Immigration Services

Free immigration legal services are available to students, staff and faculty affiliated with the Community Colleges. Priority for services is given to undocumented students, staff and faculty. The immigration legal service providers offering services at the 65 campuses have developed scheduling, intake, and reporting processes that ensure student information remains confidential and protected. While all legal providers offer legal consultations and basic immigration benefit application assistance, some providers may offer additional services.
